Beginning and experienced grant writers from city, county and state agencies as well as healthcare organizations, nonprofits, K-12, colleges and universities are encouraged to attend.



From Chadron to Nebraska City, responders have access to a state-wide interoperable communications network. The Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network (NRIN) currently links most of the State's Public Service Answering Points (PSAPs). Local responders can now use statewide communication resources and new, developing technologies through the transport capabilities that NRIN offers.

NRIN is a locally-owned, point-to-point IP-based, microwave network capable of transporting large amounts of data, radio, voice and video quickly and efficiently in a secure and reliable fashion.

The Chairman of the Governing Board, Tim Hofbauer explained the benefit of the network: "NRIN provides a great opportunity for response agencies and local government to transport data. The Network allows counties to provide dispatch function for other counties and is providing information from western Nebraska to eastern Nebraska and vice versa.
