

In recognition of FEMA's unprecedented response to the COVID-19 pandemic

and following the Administration's determination regarding the end of the

announced today that all COVID-19 incident periods will close on May 11.

FEMA will publish a Federal Register Notice providing a 90-day advance notice to government partners and stakeholders that eligibility of work and reimbursable costs will end on May 11.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, FEMA has provided more than \$104 billion in assistance to state, local, tribal, and territorial governments, as well as non-profits and survivors. Of those funds,
