



State Allocations Announced for \$42.45 Billion **High-Speed Internet Grant Program; Nebraska** over \$400M On June 26, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) of the Department of Commerce disclosed the allotment of funds to all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and five territories for the deployment of accessible and dependable high-speed internet service to everyone in the United States. This initiative, called "Internet for All," is an essential part of President Biden's "Investing in America" plan.

Each state, along with the District of Columbia and five territories, will utilize funds from

the \$42.45 billion Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program of President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to administer local grant programs.

The BEAD funding aims to make high-speed internet service more accessible and affordable for all by deploying or upgrading broadband networks. After meeting deployment goals, any remaining funds can be allocated towards eligible causes

The allocation amount for Nebraska is \$405,281,070.41. This allocation increased

Funded by the <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)</u>, \$1.18 billion is available now for eligible entities – restricted to only local governments, metropolitan planning organizations and Tribes - to develop safety action plans or to implement existing approved plans at an 80 percent federal match. Counties are directly eligible to apply
