



Nebraska Broadband Office Invites Comment on New Statewide Broadband Map

Do You Receive Access to High-Speed Internet?

As part of the Broadband, Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program, the Nebraska Broadband Office has launched the State Broadband Availability Map, which identifies the served, underserved, and unserved locations across the state. Unserved locations identified on the map will be prioritized to receive broadband buildout in this program. If there is an error, you must challenge the map to fix it. To verify your level of Internet Service, visit the Nebraska Broadband Map (LINK).

To ensure that Nebraska has access to federal funding opportunities, it is essential that the map reflects all the unserved and underserved broadband serviceable locations. As part of the map availability, there will be ongoing public engagement across the state including a series of eight public meetings and an open comment period from Sept. 14 to Oct 14. Details can be found at (LINK). The Office will only accept challenges from: nonprofit organizations;

- Iocal and tribal governments; and
- broadband service providers.

Nebraskans may submit a challenge by contacting their local government or Regional Economic Development District (EDD) serving their county. The local government or EDD will then submit the challenge on behalf of the residents. A challenge guide will be made available on December 22, 2023, prior to the start of the Challenge Period in early January.

FEMA Seeks Public Input on Simplifying Preparedness Grants

FEMA has published <u>a notice in the Federal Register</u> seeking comment on how to enhance the management and administration of its <u>preparedness grant programs</u>.

This national engagement will help the agency gain better understanding of how to continue to assist the nation and first responders in building, sustaining and improving our capability to prepare for, protect against, respond to, recover from and mitigate terrorism and other high-consequence disasters and emergencies.

FEMA will host a public listening session and one tribal consultation to allow interested parties to provide feedback.



DED Opens Applications for Second Round of Funding under 2022 Rural Workforce Housing Fund Program

The Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED) is now accepting second round applications for the 2022 Rural Workforce Housing Fund (RWHF) program year. A Letter of Intent will be due by October 19, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. CT. The last day to submit an application will be Thursday, December 7, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. CT.

2022 RWHF awards from the first application round were announced May 11, 2023. A total of \$22,805,000 was awarded to 27 organizations of the approximately \$29,555,112 available. The Department is initiating a second application round for the 2022 program year cycle for the remaining amount of approximately \$6,750,112.

Eligible applicants are Nebraska based 501(c)(3), 501(c)(4), and 501(c)(6) non-profit housing or related service organizations. More details about this funding opportunity are found in the 2022 RWHF Application Guidelines – Round Two at <u>https://opportunity.nebraska.gov/programs/housing/rwhf/</u>. Applications shall be submitted electronically through DED's Grant Management System, AmpliFund, at any time after the application live date and before the due date. NACo Cyberattack Simulation Course



In response to the growing threat landscape and complexity of the interdependent and networked business of counties, the NACo County Tech Xchange is partnering with the Professional Development Academy and their community of CISOs, CIOS, risk managers and cyber leaders to launch cyberattack simulation training.

The NACo Cyberattack Simulation is a reality-based simulation that prepares county risk leaders for cyberattacks by assessing counties' current state of readiness and identifying gaps. This simulation will help attendees evaluate their incident response procedures and tools and guide them in developing a detailed cyberattack response strategy.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Provide a certified test of incident management plans.
- Baseline current cybersecurity and risk management work capabilities.
- Strengthen the leadership skills of managers responsible for risk planning and incident resolution.
- Improve the quality of the incident management plans and playbook details.
- Develop immediate action plans to strengthen people, process, and technical security controls.

WHO SHOULD PARTICIPATE?

The NACo Cyberattack Simulation is designed for cybersecurity managers, their teams and those responsible for risk defense, protection, and recovery, including HR, policy management, finance, public safety, and emergency services.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT?

30-60 minutes per day for one week. Activities can be completed on the participants' schedule and accessed online anywhere.

WHAT IS THE COST?

The retail price of the one week Cyberattack Simulation is \$795 per enrollee; however, the simulations are fully sponsored for all counties, bringing your price down to no cost.

Governor Pillen Declares September as National Preparedness Month in Nebraska

LINCOLN, NE – Governor Jim Pillen has declared September as National Preparedness Month in Nebraska. He is reminding all Nebraskans how important it is for individuals, families, and communities to prepare for disasters and emergencies.

"Working together, we can build a prepared and resilient Nebraska," Gov. Pillen said. "While it's important for all of us to be ready when disaster strikes, this year, the National Preparedness Month campaign is focused on providing information and resources to empower older adults as they make their preparations."

"The state's local emergency managers and NEMA have plans to address a wide range of natural and man-made disasters, but individuals and families must be prepared to assume a role in personal health and safety emergency preparedness as well," said NEMA Assistant Director Erv Portis.

"Plans should include where to meet if a home is destroyed and how family members would contact each other should phone service be out," Portis said. "For instance, texting often works when phone calls don't."

Emergency managers recommend that individuals be prepared to shelter in place for a minimum of three days. Emergency workers may have a large number of people to reach in a disaster and the health of everyone could very well depend on the kit or plan Nebraskans have developed before a major disaster occurs.

To drive home preparation planning, Gov. Pillen signed a proclamation on Sept. 15, marking September as *National Preparedness Month*.
