**LINCOLN, NE** -- Governor Jim Pilla is announcing a major milestone in Nebraska's efforts to ensure all areas of the state have robust and reliable internet service. The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) has formally approved the state's Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) final proposal. This authorizes Nebraska to transition from planning to implementation of its statewide broadband expansion strategy.



# What are you "All In" on?

I'm all in on helping people. When it comes to being a dedicated public defender, you must have a passion for helping people - individually, and as a community. Our goal is to provide Constitutionally and statutorily mandated rights through the effective assistance of counsel to everyone our Office represents, to treat people fairly and humanely, and to try to help them make the connections they need to have a better life in the future. We fight for our clients daily, whether it's through pretrial motions to challenge violations of rights, having trials, or working out the best resolutions to cases for them. I also believe it is vitally important to educate our community about their rights and share that whenever and wherever I can.

I've been a public defender for 36 years, and I've seen people hurt and also helped through the criminal justice system. In order to benefit our community, and our society, as a whole, we have to work together with a common goal to help people learn to be better so that they can do better. I've seen many clients who have benefitted from treatment and classes and go on to have a better life for themselves and their families. Creating more and more felony offenses and imprisoning people isn't working. Diversion and problem solving programs and problem solving courts help. Not criminalizing mental health and substance use issues would go even farther. Diverting people from the criminal justice system from the beginning should be the goal, not the exception.

I strongly support and aid whenever I can the following: Justice in Action, Community Corrections, the Center for People, Matt Talbot, problem-solving programs and problem-solving courts, food banks, and all community agencies who support education and fairness, to enhance rights for all people so that we can be a more kind, inclusive, diverse and equitable society where the amount of money you have, your gender, the color of your skin or any other perceived differences are not barriers to justice. We are all in this together.

## FY 2024 State and Local Cybersecurity Grant – *Applications Due December 7, 2025*

We would like to invite counties interested in applying for the now-open FY 2024 State and Local Cybersecurity Grant (SLCG) opportunity. **Applications are open through December 7, 2025.**

This year's funding focuses on the Recovery Phase of the NIST SP 800-184 Cybersecurity Program, which emphasizes restoring systems and strengthening resilience following cyber incidents.

### Program Goal and Objectives

Recover Systems

**Objective 1.1:** Ensure the ability to reconstitute systems in the event of a cyber incident.

*Action:* Develop organizational projects that increase backup and restoration capabilities.

## **Objective 1.2:** Develop and assess logging practices and enhance logging.

*Action:* Implement projects focused on procuring SIEM tools or improving existing logging systems.

## **Objective 1.3:** Map networks and data flows.

*Action:* Conduct mapping of organizational networks and data flows to identify vulnerabilities and dependencies.

Increase Response Activities

## **Objective 2.1:** Develop and test cyber incident response plans.

*Action:* Conduct tabletop exercises to evaluate and improve response plans.

## **Objective 2.2:** Strengthen stakeholder coordination.

*Action:* As part of incident response planning or exercises, coordinate interaction with both internal and external stakeholders.

## **Objective 2.3:** Establish enterprise resiliency.

*Action:* Create out-of-band communications channels, off-site storage solutions, and infrastructure recovery plans; develop proactive, not reactive, cybersecurity strategies.

These objectives align with the Nebraska Cybersecurity Plan and are designed to enhance counties' readiness and recovery capabilities in the face of evolving cyber threats.


