



### BEAD Policy Revision Creates Challenges for Rural Nebraska

As you may be aware, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) released a revised policy for the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program on June 6, 2025. You can view the full policy notice here:

One of the most immediate impacts of this new policy is the removal of more than 15,000 premises from Nebraska's BEAD-eligible map. These areas are now considered "served" due to the presence of unlicensed wireless providers — a concerning interpretation given the known performance limitations of such services, especially in rural and agricultural regions.

Perhaps most concerning is the revised scoring rubric, which no longer prioritizes fiber-optic infrastructure. Instead, fixed wireless and satellite services are now scored alongside fiber. While fiber typically carries higher upfront costs per premise, it also offers a stronger return on investment over time through lower maintenance, greater capacity, and better reliability.

The new defined project area definitions will also limit opportunities to bring fiber to areas that were previously targeted under the original NBEAD framework.

During last year's challenge process, NACO and many of our partners worked diligently to secure additional resources for Nebraska. That effort brought \$105 million in additional BEAD funding to the state. However, if funding decisions are now based solely on upfront cost rather than long-term impact and infrastructure sustainability, we fear much of this money may go unused and returned to the federal government.

Wireless and satellite are good, cost-effective broadband options for areas of Nebraska; however, there are many benefits to fiber deployment, especially in areas where telehealth, precision agriculture, and remote learning demand reliable, high-capacity internet.

In response to these policy changes, we've engaged in multiple in-person and virtual meetings with NACo, NTIA, the Nebraska Broadband Office, and state and federal policymakers.

In these meetings, we are emphasizing the economic and public health stakes of this issue:

- Fiber broadband supports the precision technologies that drive Nebraska's agricultural economy.
- Our aging population, especially in areas with limited long-term care options, needs dependable broadband to age in place.
- Telehealth access is becoming critical as rural hospitals face closures and staffing shortages.

Nebraska was allocated \$405 million under the BEAD program. These funds should be used to implement the broadband strategy originally developed by the Nebraska Broadband Office and approved by NTIA - one that reflected input from local stakeholders across the state.
