County Board Members Earn Continuing Education Certification from the Nebraska Association of County Officials

Lincoln, NE — The Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) recognized <u>30 county</u> <u>board members</u> for successfully earning their level one County Board Member Certification.

<u>The NACO County Board Member Certification Program</u> enhances the professional development of county board members, ensuring they are well-equipped to meet the challenges of their roles and provide effective governance.

To achieve the level one certification, county board members completed 30 credit hours of educational workshops and training sessions over two years. Board members can upgrade their certification every two years, supporting a continuous path of career-long learning.

"One of NACO's priorities is providing educational opportunities for county officials across the state," said Jon Cannon, NACO Executive Director. "We have found that the more education our county officials are exposed to, the more ably they can serve their communities."
