## County Officials Complete County Official Online Learning Network

Lincoln, NE — On June 4, the Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) recognized the dedicated county officials who successfully completed the County Official Online Learning Network (COOL Network).

In collaboration with the University of Nebraska Extension, the COOL Network provided participants with an opportunity to connect with fellow county officials, university professors, and local government experts in a three-week online unit followed by an inperson session.

During the online training portion, topics covered included: the purpose, structure, and funding of county government, government finance, expenditures, and mandates, courthouse infrastructure, Information Technology risk management, visioning and strategic planning, and much more. The course was especially geared toward those relatively new to their role in county government.
